1. ANNOUNCEMENT:

The Hartwell Motorcycle Club, hereafter called the CLUB will conduct Rounds 1, 3 & 5 of the 2018 Hartwell Motorcycle Club Championships for motorcycles and sidecars at the State Motorcycle Sports Complex, Road Race Circuit, Broadford Victoria on February 10 & 11, April 14 & 15 and August 4 & 5, 2018.

JURISDICTION:

- 2.1. The abovementioned meetings have been authorised by Motorcycling Victoria (M.V.) which has issued the Motorcycling Australia Permit Numbers (T.B.A.) and is open to all current financial members of the Hartwell Motorcycle Club. All riders and sidecar passengers must be either holders of a current M.A. National or must take out a one event licence for the meeting. The issue of one event licences will be at the discretion of the Secretary of the meeting, with the right of appeal to the Steward as per GCR's. All Juniors competitors must comply with current GCR's rules. All riders must produce their race licence, a copy via media will only be accepted with the Steward's authorisation.
- These meetings will be held in accordance with the current General Competition Rules (GCR's), these Supplementary Regulations, 2018 2.2. Hartwell M/C Series guidelines and any final instructions approved by M.V. BY ENTERING THESE MEETINGS ALL PARTIES AGREE TO COMPLY WITH THESE RULES, REGULATIONS, BY-LAWS, HARTWELL 2018 SERIES GUIDELINES AND INSTRUCTIONS.

- Entries open forthwith and will be accepted up to C.O.B.: Round 1: Feb. 1, Round 3, April 5 & Round 5 July 26, 2018. Late entries will be 3.1. accepted with a \$50 late penalty. Entries may be rejected due to grid limitations or lack of transmitter availability. Entries will be decided upon first received basis.
- 3.2. In the case of postponement or abandonment of the meeting, all or any part of the entry fee may be retained by the Club.
- 3.3. Only entries received on the official entry form and accompanied by the correct fee will be accepted.
- 3.4. NOTE:- THE RETURN OF ENTRY FEES FOR ANY RIDER WITHDRAWING FROM THE MEETING IS AT THE DISCRETION OF THE CLUB.

CLASSES OF COMPETITION: 7

Buckets, Historic, Sidecars, 600, Over 600, Formula 400, George Carrick (one class -125 & 250 GP & Moto 3), 300 Supersport (running with Buckets), Supermono, Supermoto RR, Thunderbikes, Pre-Modern (2001-2007 (compliance June 30 2007) & P7 (1991-2000 up to 500cc) and P7 (1991-2000 Over 500) & Juniors (70cc, 85 and 160cc). The club reserves the right to abandon a class should there be insufficient entries. All races will be electronically timed by AMB transmitters which must be fitted, failure to fit properly can result in being black flagged.

AWARDS AND PRIZEMONEY:

Trophies will be presented on the day.

9 ENTRIES TO CONSTITUTE A CLASS:

Should there be insufficient entries in any class of competition, the decision to run or cancel the class, or to combine events and re-distribute any awards, will be at the discretion of the club.

10 RACE FORMAT:

Each class of competition shall participate in practice, qualifying and four championship races for the weekend,(3 at P.I.) time permitting. Each class, with the exception of the 600 & Over 600 classes, receive a practice on Saturday, qualifying and two championship races time permitting. The 600 and over 600 classes will receive a longer race in lieu of practice on Saturday. On Sunday each class receives warm up, 2 championship races, plus there will be 1 feature race on Sunday. This is subject to change pending entry totals at C.O.B.

11 MACHINES AND RIDERS:

All machines entered must comply with the current GCRs for road race competition. In addition, any machine which suffers accident damage in practice or race sessions must be re-examined before participating again. Riders assume all responsibility for their bikes compliance to the GCR's. Riders that are the cause of an on track crash and their bike found to have glycol or coolants manufactured with glycol will be subject to a fine of \$500. 10.12.14.1. Change of Machine during competition: No machine may be exchanged for another without prior approval by Clerk of Course and Race Secretary.

12 RIDING NUMBERS:

- 12.1. Wherever possible, competitors will be allocated their preferred riding number. All others will be allocated numbers at the Club's discretion.
- 12.2. All number plates on all machines **MUST** comply with the GCRs.

13 GRID POSITIONS:

Grid positions for all classes shall be determined by electronic timing of qualifying held on Saturday and these results determine the grids for the balance of the race meeting. If unable to qualify, starting positions for races on Saturday and Sunday will be rear of grid or at discretion of Clerk of Course.

14 RIDERS' BRIEFING:

A riders' briefing will be held prior to the commencement of racing, which ALL competitors <u>MUST</u> attend and sign on the sign on sheet after briefing. All first timers may have a briefing prior to Rider's briefing. All under 18 years of age riders must have parent/guardian in attendance at riders briefing and they must co-sign the rider's briefing sign on sheet.

15 DRUG AND OR ALCOHOL TESTING:

- 15.1 All competitors and officials are advised that as part of the MA drug education program, drug testing may take place at any competition in accordance with Australian Sports Commission policy as implemented by the Australian Sports Drug Agency.
- 15.2 If any doubts exist over banned substances it is recommended competitors contact the Drugs in Sport Hotline, tel 1800 020 506.

16 CODE OF CONDUCT:

All competitors, officials and parents are reminded of the Motorcycling Australia by-law - CODE OF CONDUCT (as stipulated in the GCRs), which is a guide to appropriate behaviour at all motorcycle race meetings. This CODE OF CONDUCT applies to this Meeting and will be enforced.

17 TIMETABLE:

Classes will be determined by entries received by the dates as listed under the heading of 'Entries'.

Saturday – gates open at 7am, scrutineering 7.15am, rider's briefing 8.20am, practice commences 9am, qualifying approx 10-16 mins, racing (approx.) 5 laps (approx 12noon.)

Sunday – gates open 8am, 9.00am Warm up followed by racing (approx.) 5 laps, Greg Bailey 20 mins + 1 lap. Timetable subject to change depending on entries for classes received.

For the purposes of drug and alcohol testing, the commencement of the meeting will be deemed from 7.15am Saturday with the completion of the meeting for the participant being when the participant has vacated the venue.

18 CIRCUIT DESCRIPTION:

A 2.164km bitumen sealed circuit with racing in a clockwise direction.

19 STARTS:

All events will be clutch starts. Starting will be by flag/lights red – prepare to start, Red LIGHT off for start.

20 NOISE

All machines must comply with the General Competition Rules of Motorcycling Australia. Machines not complying will be black flagged immediately upon detection and must be presented to the scrutineer for inspection. Subject to the scrutineers approval of noise reduction measures, the machine may be cleared to recommence racing. A second infringement will result in immediate black flagging and exclusion from the meeting.

21 SCRUTINEERING

The only liquid coolant permitted is water and no-glycol coolants. Glycol and coolants manufactured with glycol are not allowed. (as per GCR 10.17.1.10) All riders <u>must wear their riding gear to scrutineering including back protector</u>, you may carry your helmet and gloves. All or board cameras must be approved by scrutineer prior to entering the track. Timing transmitters must be fitted onto machines prior to presentation to scrutineering.
